

FUND STRATEGY

The Fund seeks to achieve its investment objective by investing in the common stocks of small and mid-cap companies which have the potential to deliver above-average long-term earnings growth, in which earnings and sales growth, valuation, and profitability are assessed through fundamental-based research. The Fund looks for companies which are market leaders in growth industries, have a strong brand name, and whose sales and earnings have increased at a consistent rate. The investment approach includes the analysis of company financial statements in addition to meeting with corporate managements.

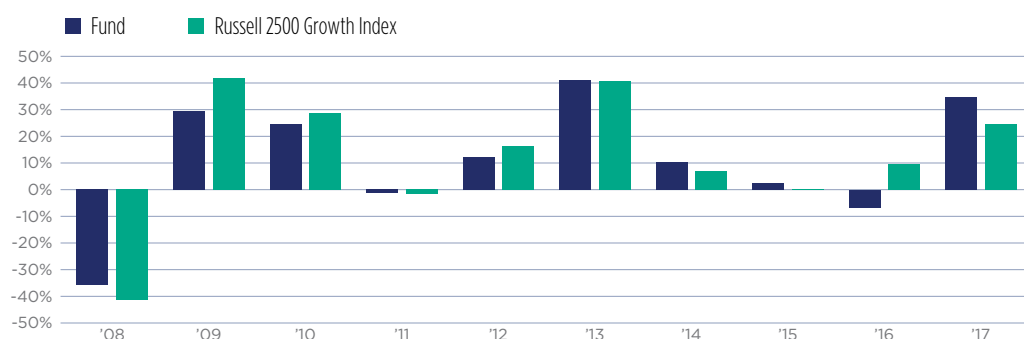

QUARTERLY UPDATE

- The Fund appreciated 7.80% during 1Q 2018 and outperformed the Russell 2500 Growth Index which gained 2.38%. On the heels of last quarter's takeover of Kite Pharmaceutical, one of the portfolio's significant positions, the Fund benefitted from three takeovers during the first quarter of the year. Juno Therapeutics was acquired by Celgene; Oclaro was acquired by Lumentum, a current investment in the Fund; and Callidus Software was acquired by SAP, the fourth takeover of a Fund position by SAP over the past several years.
- Information Technology, Health Care, and Financial investments were the leading contributors to Fund performance during the quarter on an absolute basis. Meanwhile, Materials and Industrials sector investments detracted from performance over this period. Of the top 10 contributors, six were Software as a Service (SaaS) providers, including: ServiceNow, New Relic, Workday, Paycom, Shopify and Proofpoint. NVIDIA, the largest position in the Fund, was also the leading contributor to performance. Two biotechnology investments were among the top 10 contributors, Spark Therapeutics, where gene therapy for an inherited retinal disease was recently approved and efforts in hemophilia A/B continue to progress, and Sarepta Therapeutics, which continues to advance DMD (Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy) in expanded mutations. Investments in Universal Display, TESARO, and Clovis Oncology impacted performance most negatively, by about 120 basis points collectively. TESARO and Clovis have pioneered approved PARP therapies for ovarian cancer. Universal Display holds key patents for OLED displays.
- At the end of the quarter, the Top 10 and Top 25 investments comprised 35% and 55% of the Fund's holdings, respectively. The Top 100 investments comprised 88% of the portfolio. The Fund held no investments in Energy, Telecommunications, and Utilities, versus the benchmark's combined weightings of 2.5%.

FUND OBJECTIVE

The Tocqueville Opportunity Fund's investment objective is long-term capital appreciation.

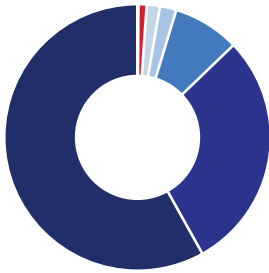

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

P/E: The weighted average of the price/earnings (P/E) ratios of the equity securities referenced. The P/E ratio is calculated by dividing the current price of the stock by the trailing earnings per share for the past 12 months.

The Russell 2500 Growth Index measures the performance of the small to mid-cap growth segment of the U.S. equity universe. It includes those Russell 2500 companies with higher price-to-book ratios and higher forecasted growth values. You cannot invest directly in an index.

The Morningstar Mid Cap Growth Portfolios feature firms that are projected to grow faster than other mid-cap stocks. The U.S. mid cap range for market capitalization typically falls between \$1 billion and \$8 billion and represents 20% of the total capitalization of the U.S. equity market. Growth is defined based on fast growth (high growth rates for earnings, sales, book value, and cash flow) and high valuations (high price ratios and low dividend yields).

The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history.
